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## LINDSAY EXHIBITION RULES & REGULATIONS


- 1. All exhibitors must obey the general rules of the Lindsay Exhibition as well as the individual regulations of each division. An exhibitor violating any rule or regulation of this Society, at the discretion of the Board of Directors, may be required to forfeit all prizes won, and may be subject to other penalties as the Board may see fit.
- THE LINDSAY AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY reserves all rights to its grounds and may restrict or prohibit admittance to the grounds to any person or group of persons without giving reason for such action. Further, the Society may refuse the privilege of exhibiting to any individual without disclosing the reasons for such refusal. All members, exhibitors and others must place animals, cars, trucks and exhibits as instructed by the officials or remove same from the grounds.
- MEMBERSHIP: Any persons, on the payment of the annual membership fee of \$15.00, shall be enrolled as a member of the Society for the current year and as such shall be entitled to the advantages and privileges conferred on members under the rules of the Exhibition. No membership fee will be retained from winners for their membership for the following year.
- **OWNERSHIP:** Animals or articles entered for competition must be the bona fide property of the person entering them, and with the exception of animals, must have been grown, produced, manufactured or made in the present year by the person or persons entering them. If any doubt arises on the subject, proof will be required. The President, Vice-President or General Manager shall be obliged to cause any exhibitor with reference to whom such doubt exists, to make satisfactory declaration of compliance with the terms of the said Rule. If any person shall enter an article for exhibition as produced or manufactured by himself or herself when it has not really been so, he or she shall forfeit all prizes, which may be awarded to him, and shall be precluded from exhibiting in the future.
- Exhibitors will receive **Admission Passes** to the email that is listed on the entry form. Exhibitor admission passes will be allocated based on the number of livestock entered.
- PRIZES: Should there be only one exhibitor in a class or section, the Judges may use their discretion as to awarding any premium. The Judges shall in no case award any prize unless they consider the exhibit actually worthy of such prize. No person shall be a Judge of any article or any class that they are interested in as an exhibitor, agent, employee or otherwise.
- **ALCOHOL:** Consumption of alcohol in the Livestock Buildings is prohibited. Following one warning the exhibitor will forfeit their prize money. This rule will be strictly enforced.
- **GLASS CONTAINERS:** Absolutely no glass containers will be allowed in the Livestock Buildings or wash racks. Following one warning the exhibitor will forfeit their prize money. This rule will be strictly enforced.

- **SMOKING:** Absolutely no smoking in the Livestock Buildings, or any other buildings. Following one warning the exhibitor will forfeit their prize money. This Rule will be strictly enforced.
- 10. ENTRIES: All entries must be made on entry forms supplied with prize list, including all requested information. PLEASE NOTE: Insurance information is required on entry forms. All entry forms must be in the Lindsay Exhibition Office on or before the closing date of entries as listed in the prize list. Entry fees and administration fees must accompany entry forms. Entries can be made online at https://www.assistexpo.ca/lindsayex

- 11. TRUCK PARKING: Immediately following unloading, all trucks MUST be moved to the stipulated truck parking area. Trucks and trailers not parked where directed may be towed at owner's expense. Your understanding and cooperation is appreciated.
- 12. FIRE RESTRICTIONS: No one is allowed to leave a vehicle in front of any building by order of the Fire Chief.
- 13. **DISTURBANCES:** An exhibitor who is guilty of creating a disturbance, whether by openly criticizing the Judge or using obscene language to any Judge or Official, shall forfeit the right to any premium and may be suspended by the Society from exhibiting.
- 14. FRAUD: Upon the discovery of fraud, deception, or dishonest practice, either in preparation, ownership, or of any misrepresentation concerning any article exhibited which may be affected, or may have been intended to affect the decision of the Judges, the Board of Directors shall have the power to withhold the payment of any prize awarded, and may prohibit any such party or parties from exhibition in any class for one or more years, and may publish the names of such persons or not as deemed most expedient.
- 15. **COMPLAINTS:** Complaints as to errors in premiums must be made known to the General Manager before the close of the Exhibition in order to be considered. No protest will be considered unless a deposit of \$25.00 accompanies it. The deposit to become the property of the Exhibition if protest is not sustained, but if sustained, the full amount will be returned to the party who entered the protest.
- 16. PREMIUMS: Premiums won in all classes of livestock will be paid by cheque as soon as possible following the Exhibition. Exhibitors who do not receive prize money by November 14th, 2024, are asked to contact the Exhibition Office at once, submitting an itemized statement of prizes claimed.
  - \*\*NOTE: Prize cheques must be cashed by April 1st, 2025.
- 17. STRAW: Absolutely NO STRAW will be provided by the Lindsay Exhibition.

- 18. **SAFETY:** While the Directors will take every possible precaution under the circumstances to secure the safety of articles sent to the Exhibition, the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting, and should any articles be accidentally injured, lost, or stolen, the Directors will give all assistance in their power towards its recovery, but will not make any payments for the value.
- LIABILITY INSURANCE: All Exhibitors and participants must carry a Public Liability Insurance (minimum \$2 million). The Society will not be responsible for any accidents. Insurance information is required on entry forms.
- 20. **UNMANAGEABLE ANIMALS:** Animals not under sufficient control shall not be allowed to compete.
- ATTIRE: Neatness of dress in the ring is required in all divisions.
- 22. **HUCKSTERING:** The Society, under the Agricultural and Horticultural Organizations Act has the power to enforce all its rules and regulations, and the right to prohibit and prevent theatrical, circus, or acrobatic performances, exhibitions or shows, all kinds of gambling, soliciting for funds, the huckstering or trafficking in fruits, goods, wares or merchandise on the Exhibition grounds, or within three hundred yards thereof; and any person who, after due notice of such rules, violates same, will be removed by police officers or officers of the said society, and will be liable to penalty prescribed.
- 23. **PENALTIES:** Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of the Agricultural and Horticultural Organizations Act, or the regulations or any rule or

- regulation of a Society under subsection 2 of section 19 or who gains admission to the ground's contrary to the rules of the society is guilty of an offence, and on summary conviction is liable to a fine of not more than \$100.00.
- 24. The Society reserves the right to interpret its own rules and regulations, and should any dispute or question arise not provided for in the rules and regulations, the decision of the Board of Directors shall be final.
- 25. In the event admissions to the exhibition are reduced due to weather conditions, the Board of Directors reserves the right to reduce the amount of premiums to be paid.
- 26. PETS: No pets, except certified service animals are allowed on the Exhibition grounds. No dogs, including Exhibitor's dogs, are allowed in the barns during the Exhibition.
- 27. A \$25.00 service charge will be applied to NSF cheques.
- 28. REFUND: AMINISTRATION FEES are non-refundable. NO EXCEPTIONS.
  ENTRY FREES will be refunded if cancelled 24 hours prior to the start of the show entered. Proper medical documentation of show person or animal must be submitted. The justification for withdrawing entries must be submitted at time of notice of cancellation.

#### Rules for 2024 Fairs & 2025 Convention

- 1. Please review the General Competition Rules document.
- 2. Entry must be made solely by the person entering the competition. (including the pastry).
- 3. Number of butter tarts to be shown at local fair/exhibition to be determined by each individual fair/exhibition.

#### **District Competition**

- 1. A total of 6 tarts will be required to be shown. Tarts must be on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates) inside of a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name, mailing address and fair represented.
- 2. The size of the tarts must be full size tarts. (no mini or bite size tarts) and must not contain fruit or nuts (i.e.. no raisins, no pecans
- 3. If the exhibitor has won at more than one fair, the one closest to the exhibitor's home address is the agricultural society from which the entry will be sent to the district competition. The other agricultural societies may send their second place winner into the district competition. An exhibitor may only enter into one district competition.

#### **Provincial Competition**

- 1. A total of 6 tarts will be required to be shown. Tarts must be on a clean, sturdy plate (no paper plates) inside of a clear plastic bag with the exhibitor's name, mailing address and district represented.
- 2. The size of the tarts must be full size tarts. (no mini or bite size tarts) and must not contain fruit or nuts (i.e.. no raisins, no pecans).
- 3. 1st and 2nd place entries will not be returned to exhibitor but will be placed up for auction at the convention.

## **HOMECRAFT RULES & REGULATIONS**

- EXHIBITOR: Each Exhibitor must pay a \$10.00 administration fee. Administration fee must accompany all entry forms except in: Special Needs (9001 - 9028), and Manor (9101- 9162).
- ENTRY CLOSING DATE: Closing date for Homecraft entries is WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 4, 2024. Entry forms received after this time will be charged A LATE FEE OF \$5.00. ABSOLUTELY NO ENTRY FORMS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 11, 2024.
- ENTRIES ALLOWED: Exhibitors may make ONE ENTRY only and receive ONE PRIZE only in each class.
- 4. TAGS: Exhibitor tags will be ready for pick up at the LEX office after 9:00 am Friday, September 13, 2024. Tags may not be picked up at the time of bringing in entry forms. \*\* Tags must be attached to the exhibit with flap closed upon Drop-Off.\*\* Tags do not need to be signed. \*\* ENTRY TAGS MUST NOT BE ALTERED OR CHANGED BY THE EXHIBITOR. ARTICLES WITH ALTERED TAGS WILL BE DISQUALIFIED AND NOT JUDGED. The Lindsay Exhibition Homecraft Committee reserves the right to open all entry tags after judging has been completed.
- EXHIBIT DROP-OFF: Exhibits should be brought to the Commonwell Exhibition Building between 9:00 am and 8:00 pm on Monday, September 16, 2024. MANORS & SPECIAL NEEDS entries must be dropped off by 2:00 pm on Friday, September 13, 2024.
- 6. **JUDGING: MANORS & SPECIAL NEEDS** judging will begin Friday, September 13 at 2:00 pm. **ALL OTHER DIVISIONS** judging begins Tuesday, September 17, 2024, at 9:00 am.
- EXHIBIT PICK-UP: Exhibitors must present their Exhibitor Card to claim their articles. Exhibits may not be removed until Monday, September 23, 2024, after 9:00 am and must be removed by 7:00 pm. \*Please note there will no longer be Sunday pickup.
- NEW EXHIBITS ONLY. (Excluding quilts) All items entered for competition must be NEW work, made by the exhibitor and completed since September 2023, this rule applies to all Homecraft classes (except quilts) and will be strictly enforced. Items shown in previous years will be disqualified.
- All articles for competition must be strictly the production of the person making the entry unless otherwise specified in the class description. Articles must not have any identifying name or label on them.
- 10. Articles soiled, defaced by wear, or having unpleasant odour may not be eligible for competition.

- 11. ABSENCE OF COMPETITION: In the absence of competition in any section or if articles exhibited are of inferior quality, the judge will award only such premiums as they deem the exhibits merit. Judges are asked to adhere to this rule.
- 12. FRAUD: Upon the discovery of any fraud, deception, or dishonest practice, either in the preparation, ownership, or any fraudulent representation concerning any article exhibited, the Committee shall have the power to withhold the payment of any or all the premiums awarded to the Exhibitor proven to be guilty of such an offense.
- 13. **RESPONSIBILITY:** While the Committee members will take every possible precaution under the circumstances to ensure the safety of articles sent to the LEX, the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting. Should any article be accidentally damaged, lost, or stolen, the Committee members will give all the assistance in their power towards its discovery, but no payment for the value thereof will be made.
- 14. NO "FOR SALE" SIGNAGE: Exhibits may not be sold in the Exhibition Building. No advertising or signs will be allowed on exhibits. Exhibits are not to be sold at or during the fair in the exhibit hall.
- 15. The Homecraft Committee reserves the right to interpret their own rules and regulations.
- 16. Article means one item as specified. Pair means two.
- 17. "Size" where specified is important please read rules carefully.
- 18. Individuals who sponsor a 'Special' class in the Homecraft Division will not be eligible to enter in that particular class. This pertains to all Homecraft special classes.
- 19. Absolutely no cannabis or cannabis by-products allowed.
- PRIZE MONEY: Prize money won will be paid by cheque and mailed in October. Cheques MUST be cashed by APRIL 1, 2025.
- 21. For classes with less than 5 entries, prize money will only be awarded for 1st and 2nd placed exhibits. For classes with 5 entries or more, prize money will be awarded to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd placed exhibits. For classes where a gift certificate or other item is awarded in lieu of prize money, the associated prizes will be awarded to all placings, including any prize money. Sponsored classes are paid in full, regardless of the number of entries.

# Recipes

## Maple Syrup Granola Recipe

To be used for Class 8 of Division 81

Ingredients	Instructions
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2/3 Cup Maple Syrup
1/3 Cup Packed Brown Sugar

Raisins OR Crasins

2 Tsp Vanilla

4 Cups Old Fashion Oats 1 Cup Sliced Almonds 1 Cup Flaked Coconut 1/2 Cup Sunflower Seeds

2 Cups

Preheat oven to 300ºF.

Combine maple syrup and sugar in a medium saucepan, on medium heat. Stir frequently until the sugar has dissolved, then remove from heat.

Add vanilla & stir in.

In separate bowl, combine dry ingredients, reserve raisins/craisins. Once combined, add syrup mixture to dry ingredients. Stir until all dry ingredients are thoroughly covered.

Prepare a baking sheet with cooking spray. Pour mixture onto sheet and spread evenly

Cook for 20 minutes, stirring at 5-minute intervals. Add raisins/craisins in last 10 minutes of cook time, then continue to stir at 5-minute intervals or until golden brown and crunchy.

## Honey Oatmeal Cookie Recipe

To be used for Class 17 of Division 82

## Ingredients Instructions

1 cup honey 1/2 tsp salt

1/2 cup shortening 1 2/3 cups rolled oats

1 egg, beaten 4 tbsp sour milk *or* buttermilk

1 1/2 cups sifted flour 1/2 tsp baking soda 1 cup raisins In a large bowl cream together honey and shortening.

Beat in egg until smooth.

Sift together flour, baking soda and salt.

Mix with rolled oats. Add dry ingredients alternately with sour milk to

creamed mixture. Mix well and stir in raisins.

Drop by spoonful's onto an ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 375° for 12-15  $\,$ 

minutes.

Makes 2 dozen cookies.

## Banana Raisin Muffins Recipe

To be used for Class 18 of Division 82

## Ingredients Instructions

1 1/4 cups all purpose flour 2 tsp baking powder 1 tsp baking soda 1/4 cup honey 1 egg 1 tbsp milk

1/2 tsp salt
1/2 cup raisins
1/3 cup oil
1/4 tsp vanilla

1 cup mashed, ripe banana

Combine dry ingredients and raisins. Stir together honey, banana, egg, milk, oil and vanilla. Add liquid ingredients to dry ingredients. Stir just to blend.

Fill greased muffin tins 3/4 full.

Bake at 400° for 18-20 minutes or until lightly browned.

Makes 12 muffins.

Maple syrup exhibits shall consist of one (1) curved Kent style glass bottle (D&G #505188 Syrup Bottle with Handle), or equivalent, of Maple Syrup, Canada Grade A - Amber, having a capacity of 250 mL.

Each agricultural society is entitled to send their best of show to the district competition.

If the exhibitor has won at more than one fair, the one closest to the exhibitor's home address is the agricultural society from which the entry will be sent to the district competition. The other agricultural societies may send their second-place winner into the district competition. An exhibitor may only enter into one district competition.

The OAAS will award a ribbon to exhibitors of winning entries at each district competition.

#### **Provincial Competition**

Maple syrup exhibits shall consist of two (2) curved Kent style glass bottles (D&G #505188 Syrup Bottle with Handle), or equivalent, of Maple Syrup, Canada Grade A - Amber, each having a capacity of 250 mL.

Any maple syrup entry containing any form of foreign material will be disqualified from the competition.

Maple syrup will be judged using the standards published by the OAAS in Agriculture & Horticulture Judging Standards for Ontario Fairs. An approved maple syrup colorimeter will be used to assess the colour.

1st and 2nd place entries will be placed up for auction at the convention. Other entries will be returned.


